


HU Yifan is a picture book artist and visual designer. He has an MA in picture book design from the Central Academy of Fine Arts (CAFA). "Breathe" was his awardwinning graduation project, and is now in the CAFA Museum collection. It has continued to win many awards domestically, including the BIBF Ananas International Illustration Exhibition.

HU Yifan is famous for using poetic expression in picture books and other media to show reality and imagination. His picture book "Breathe" was awarded the Central Academy of Fine Arts (CAFA) Graduate Creative Excellence Award; a 2021 BIBF Ananas Internation Illustration Exhibition Newcomer Award; and was selected for the dPICTUS World's 100 Best Picture Books 2023.

His picture book "Dot and Dots" won the CAFA graduation creation first prize, and is now in the CAFA Art Museum collection.



In a small town named Chimney Town, each resident has a chimney on their head, from which yellow smoke emerges when they're happy and blue smoke when they're sad, painting the sky above the town in vibrant colors. One day, a bird's egg accidentally falls into the chimney of a little girl. In order to safeguard the egg, she holds in her emotion, and her smoke. But her face grows bigger and redder!

The narrative explores the little girl's innocent logic and brave perseverance in protecting the egg, while metaphorically comparing chimneys to emotional outlets, conveying to children (and adults) the importance of expressing and releasing their feelings.






Author/Illustrator






Author/Illustrator

Huishan clay figurines are small round figurines made in clay from the Huishan Mountains, and painted in bright colors, which have a history of 400 years, developed and flourished.

One day, an artist makes a figurine that looks like a little girl, and calls her Ah Fu. With a silent smile, the clay figurine Ah Fu tells people that when they are afraid of something, all they have to do is to say "It's not so big, it's not so big" and face it with a smile. The book is a riot of color and great fun. Using humor, it encourages children not to be scared of things they don't know.

The story then follows a two-stranded narrative, one about Wu's remorse for what he had done, and the other about the snail's experience. The two strands never meet, although the clever plot neatly interlinks them.







Author/Illustrator

Da Wu, born in the 1990s, is a picture book writer and illustrator, whose writing has featured in Reading Friends, Youth Digest and other publications. He has illustrated for writers such as Keigo Higashino, Li Juan and Liu Liangcheng. His picture book, "The King of Trees", was selected as a dPICTUS Top 100 Outstanding Picture Books in the World in 2019, and was exhibited at the Frankfurt Book Fair. "Birds and Statues" won the New Talent Prize at the 2019 BIBF Ananas International Illustration Exhibition. His work "A Ride down to the River" has been selected in the 100 Amazing Booshelf Award Bologna Children's Book Fair 2023.

Yulu (Rain Dew) is a girl who loves painting. When she paints on a canvas originally meant for a famous painter, her self-portraits keep melting. However, Yulu preservers, and after numerous attempts, she finally receives the approval of the canvas. This book depicts metaphorically the struggle and reconciliation between the little girl and the canvas, and her ultimate breakthrough as a talented painter.

CAO Wenxuan is a prolific Chinese novelist, most known for his Children's literature works. He is the first Chinese author to receive the Hans Christian Anderson Award (2016). This is his first collaboration with Suzy Lee.

Suzy Lee is a Korean picture-book maker. She is the first Korean to win the prestigious Hans Christian Andersen Award (2022) for lifetime achievement in illustrating children's books.

But in looking up to others, we often forget to appreciate our own circumstances.





Author

CAO Wenxuan is an acclaimed novelist of children's literature, best known for winning the prestigious Hans Christian Andersen Award in 2016. He was the first Chinese author to ever receive the award. In 2015, his book "Dingding and Dangdang" series was selected as one of IBBY's Outstanding Books for Young People with Disabilities. In 2017, his book "Bronze and Sunflower" was selected as a Kirkus finalist and a New York Times Notable Children's Book. Cao's English translator of all his works Helen Wang won the 2017 Marsh Award for Children's Literature in Translation. Cao's work has been translated into English, French, German, Italian, Russian, Japanese, and Korean. Several of his works have also been adapted into films.

Illustrator

Alessandro Sanna has earned wide recognition across Europe as an illustrator and author, and his work has appeared in the New York Times Book Review and the New Yorker. He is a prolific and popular creator of illustrated books for children and readers of all ages and has received many awards and had many exhibitions. He lives and works in Mantua, Italy. He has created more than 70 works and always insisted on hand painting and is famous for his natural and unrestrained watercolor painting and wild imagination.

In order to support the family, a young boy wakes up before dawn and goes to a meadow miles away to cut thatch with his grandfather. After a hard day's work, they head home with a a cart full of grass. That evening, they encounter a violent gale. Despite their attempts to fight against it, the gale eventually blows their harvest away.

A vivid portrayal of Chinese rural scenery, Zhu Chengliang's illustrations convey the vigor and power of the wilderness. This book was based on Mo Yan's short story "大风" (The Gale).



MO Yan won the Nobel Prize in Literature in 2012. His first piece of work was published in 1981. His novel Red Sorghum (1986) was made into a film which won the Golden Bear award at the Berlin International Film Festival in 1988.


Illustrator

ZHU Chengliang has been Illustrating for children since 1984, and is perhaps the most recognizable and acclaimed contemporary illustrator from China. He was the first Chinese picture book artist to be named in the prestigious New York Times "Best Picture Books" list – for his illustrations to Yu Li-Qiong's A New Year's Reunion (2008). He has also illustrated Flame (2007), Playing with Lanterns (2017), and Sweet Laba Congee (2020).











His books have been named to the IBBY Honour List, received first prize in the Feng Zikai Children's Book Award contest, been named one of the Ten Best Illustrated Books by the New York Times, and been named Runner Up in the UNESCO Noma Concours for Picture Book Illustrations. He is best known internationally for his illustrations to Yu Li-Qiong's A New Year's Reunion, which was selected for the New York Times Top 10 Best Illustrated Picture Books.
